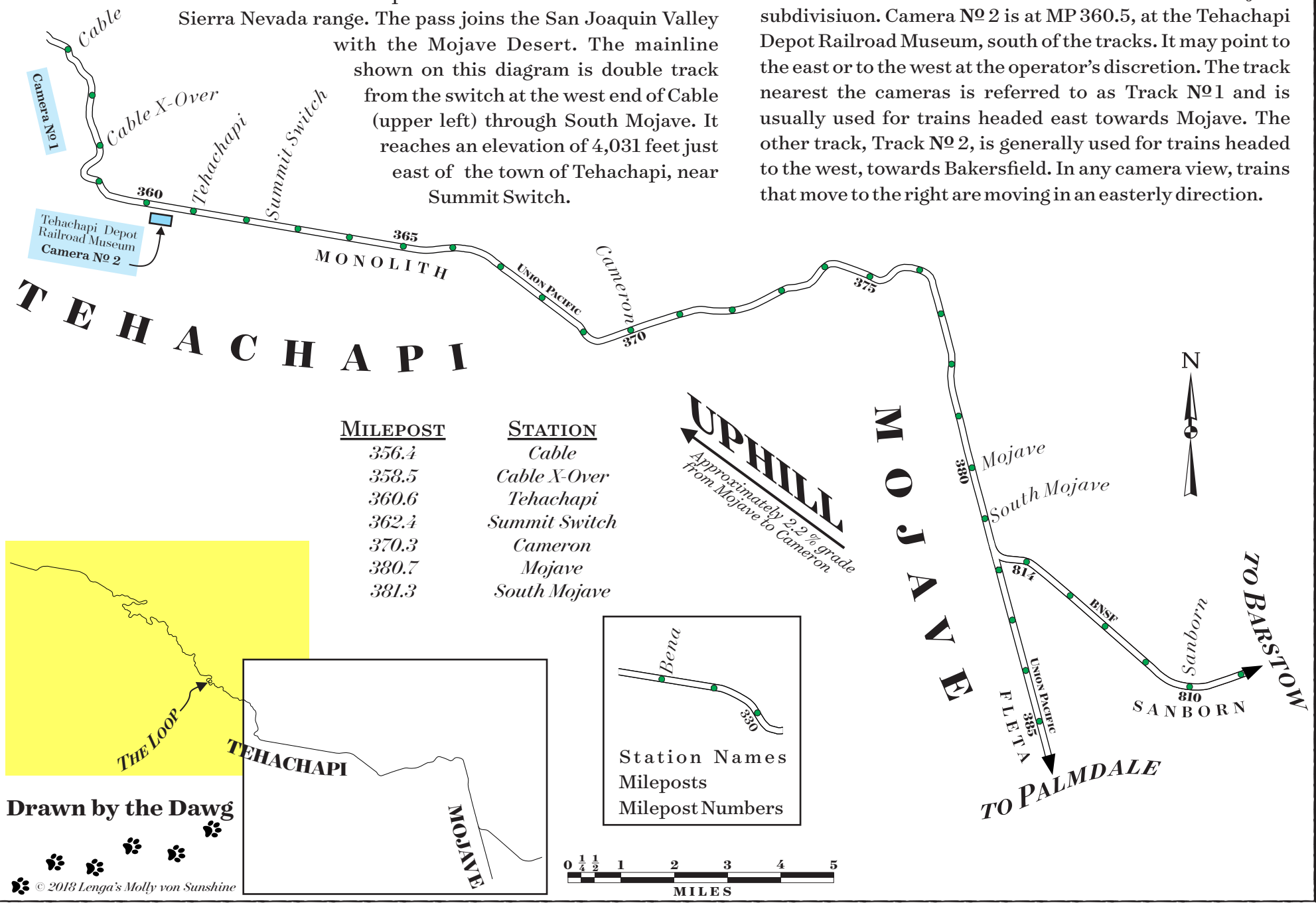
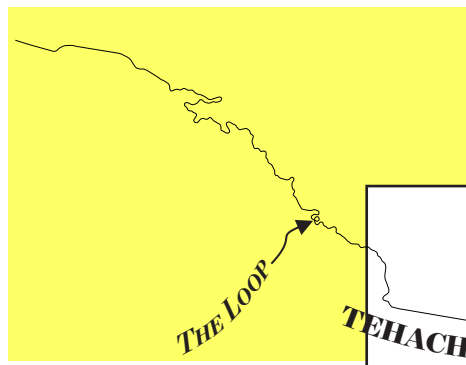


This diagram shows a portion of the railroad in the Tehachapi Pass crossing the Tehachapi Mountains in Kern County, California. The pass marks the northeast end of the Tehachapis and the south end of California's Sierra Nevada range. The pass joins the San Joaquin Valley with the Mojave Desert. The mainline shown on this diagram is double track from the switch at the west end of Cable (upper left) through South Mojave. It reaches an elevation of 4,031 feet just east of the town of Tehachapi, near Summit Switch.

TEHACHAPI LIVE TRAIN CAMS operates two video cameras. Camera No 1 is showing less than a mile of track, centered near MP 357 of Union Pacific's Mojave subdivision. Camera No 2 is at MP 360.5, at the Tehachapi Depot Railroad Museum, south of the tracks. It may point to the east or to the west at the operator's discretion. The track nearest the cameras is referred to as Track No 1 and is usually used for trains headed east towards Mojave. The other track, Track No 2, is generally used for trains headed to the west, towards Bakersfield. In any camera view, trains that move to the right are moving in an easterly direction.
